A New Law Satisfies Support Payments

A new state law satisfies a limited amount of child support. Satisfy means to give credit for some of the support owed to the State.

What support is satisfied? Unpaid child support older than October 1, 1997 that is owed to the State is satisfied.

Why isn't all my unpaid support satisfied? The law clearly says what support can be satisfied. The law limits the satisfaction to support owed to the State.

How much support is being satisfied? The amount satisfied on your case is \$_ and is payable to the State.

Do I still owe any support? You may still owe support to the family or to the State.
