




Health and Human Services

Services

Case managers work with individuals, and their families to coordinate medical, social, educational, housing, transportation, vocational, and other necessary services and supports.
Responsibilities include:





- Working with the individual and members of the service team to develop an individualized integrated plan of care
- Monitoring the individual to assess their ongoing health, safety, and wellbeing

Staff Competencies

Evidence-based practice models include:

- Person Centered Planning
- Positive Behavioral Supports
- Strengths-Based Case Management
- Motivational Interviewing
- Trauma Informed Care
- Integrated Care: Integration and coordination of primary care, behavioral health services, and long-term, community-based services and supports.

Eligibility

Iowa Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Targeted Case Management (TCM) serves individuals who are eligible for the following Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waivers:

- Intellectual Disability (ID)
- Brain Injury (BI)
- Health and Disability (HD)
- Physical Disability (PD)
- Human Immunodeficiency Virus (AIDS/HIV)
- Elderly

HHS TCM also assists individuals who may not be receiving HCBS Waiver services who meet the criteria for development disability and for targeted case management.

Local services are delivered at home, in the community, and in other places where people need them the most.







Qualifications

- Accredited by the Iowa Department of Health and Human Services though 441 Iowa Administrative Code, Chapter 24: Accreditation of Providers of Services to Persons with Mental Illness, Intellectual Disabilities, or Developmental Disabilities.
- Meets federal criteria for conflictfree case management. HHS TCM is administratively separate from funding entities.
- Utilizes a HIPAA compliant Electronic Medical Records and billing system.
- Meets training, staff qualifications, and other State and federal requirements for case management services/care coordination services.
- Provides continuous monitoring of administrative budgets to ensure compliance with State and federal requirements.
