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Pursuant to the provisions of Iowa Code Sections 17A.18, 147A.7, and Iowa Administrative Code (I.A.C.) 641-131.7, the Iowa Department of Public Health is proposing to **Revoke** your EMS certification identified above.

The department may revoke an EMS certification when it finds that the applicant or certificate holder has committed any of the following acts or offenses:


Failure to comply with the terms of a department order or the terms of a settlement agreement or consent order. IAC 641-131.7(3)i

The following has led to this notice:

On March 22, 2016 the department placed your EMR certification on probation for a period of two years. As a condition of your probation you are required to submit quarterly probation reports to the department no later than January 10, April 10, July 10, and October 10 of each year while your certification is in a probationary status. The probation report due July 10, 2016 was received by the department on August 1, 2016. The probation report due October 10, 2016 was received by the department on October 13, 2017. The probation report due January 10, 2017 was received by the department on January 11, 2017. As of December 18, 2017 you have not submitted a probation report for the 1st, 2nd or 3rd quarter of 2017.

You have the right to request a hearing concerning this notice of disciplinary action. A request for a hearing must be submitted in writing to the Department by certified mail, return receipt requested, within twenty (20) days of receipt of this Notice of Proposed Action. The written request must be submitted to the Iowa Department of Public Health, Bureau of Emergency Medical Services, Lucas State Office Building, 321 E 12th St, Des Moines, Iowa 50319. If the request is made within the twenty (20) day time limit, the proposed action is suspended pending the outcome of the hearing. Prior to or at the hearing, the Department may rescind the notice upon satisfaction that the reason for the action has been or will be removed.

If no request for a hearing is received within the twenty (20) day time period, the disciplinary action proposed herein shall become effective and shall be final agency action.
