Ryan White Part B Program – 2024

The Iowa Ryan White Part B Program (RWPB) provides services to low-income lowans living with HIV through the **Client Services Program** and the **Benefits & Drug Assistance Program (BDAP)**.

The **Client Services Program** provides a variety of support services designed to engage and retain clients in medical care. **BDAP** provides access to treatment by purchasing medications and health insurance for clients or by assisting with their existing health insurance costs.


Engagement

At the end of 2024, there were **3,440** lowans who were diagnosed and living with HIV. The RWPB program served **2,657** clients (77% of all lowans diagnosed and living with HIV). BDAP served **1,239** clients (36% of all lowans diagnosed and living with HIV).

Locations

RWPB directly contracted with nine agencies across the state in 2024. Two agencies then subcontracted services with two additional agencies, for 11 total organizations that provided RWPB services in Iowa.

Food Assistance was the most utilized service in 2024. It included the provision of grocery store gift cards, nutritional supplements (e.g., Ensure) and personal hygiene or household cleaning products.

Transportation Assistance included the provision of bus passes, taxi vouchers and gas cards; partnerships with UberHealth; and direct transportation of clients by agency staff.

Health Insurance Premium & Cost Sharing included premium, copay or deductible payments.

Emergency Financial Assistance included short-term payments that helped clients access or remain in care (e.g., utility bills).

Housing included the provision of rent and housing assistance.
