# Cherokee Mental Health Institute (CMHI)

- Location: Cherokee, Iowa
- Services: Short-term, acute psychiatric care for mental illness
- Population served: Children, adolescents, and adults with severe symptoms of mental illness
- Staff (as of 12/27/22): 162
- Capacity: 36 (24 adult & 12 child/adolescent beds)
- Current Census (as of 12/27/22): 29 (24 adults & 5 children/adolescents)
- Average Daily Census (FY22): 35 (24 adult & 11 children/adolescents)
- Annual Admissions (FY22): 133 adults & 197 children/adolescents
- Average Length of Stay (FY22): 55 days for adults & 19 days for children/adolescents

# Civil Commitment Unit for Sexual Offenders (CCUSO)

#### Location: Cherokee, Iowa

- Population Served: Individuals who have been committed by the court for treatment purposes. The department cannot deny a court-ordered admission. Annual court reviews of progress are required to determine if the commitment will continue.
- Services: Secure, long-term highly structured inpatient treatment

- Capacity: 144 (122 secure & 22 transition)
- Census (as of 12/27/22): 134 secure & 14 transition

Independence Mental Health Institute (IMHI)

- **Location:** Independence, Iowa
- Services: Short-term, acute psychiatric care for mental illness
- Population served: Children, adolescents, and adults with severe symptoms of mental illness
- Staff (as of 12/27/22): 173
- Capacity: 56 (40 adult & 16 child/adolescent beds)
- Current Census (as of 12/27/22): 49 (35 adults & 14 children/adolescents)
- Average Daily Census (FY22): 51 (39 adult & 12 children/adolescents)
