3rd highest in the nation for binge drinking

and

6th highest in the nation for heavy drinking

Important Definitions:

The BRFSS defines **a standard drink** as one 12-ounce beer, one 5-ounce glass of wine, or a drink with one shot of hard liquor.

Binge Drinking: The consumption of 5 or more alcoholic drinks for men and 4 or more alcoholic drinks for women on one occasion, in the past 30 days.

Heavy Drinking: The consumption of more than 14 drinks per week for men or more than 7 drinks per week for women, in the past 30 days.

of lowans reported they had <u>at least one drink</u> of alcohol in the past month 21.5%

of lowans reported <u>binge drinking</u> in the past month 8.3%

of lowans reported <u>heavy drinking</u> in the past month



Heavy drinking significantly increased from 6.7% in 2019 to 8.3% in 2020





Binge drinking (25.7%) and **heavy drinking** (11.1%) rates were **higher** for lowans who reported **poor mental health**

The BRFSS is an annual, state-based telephone survey that collects data on chronic health conditions, health-related risk behaviors, use of clinical preventive practices, and health care access. BRFSS data are used to measure population health over time, design public health programming and policies, inform strategies to improve the health of lowans, and track progress towards public health goals.
