# CROSSWALK: INDIVIDUAL AND FAMILY SERVICES (February 10, 2021)

## INDIVIDUAL AND FAMILY SERVICES

The following 7 pages include all 7 CSBG service categories. Under each CSBG service category is a list of individual and family services. Next to each individual and family service, if applicable, are <u>common</u> lowa community action programs that provide that service.

Agencies should use this crosswalk to assist them in reporting the unduplicated number of individuals or households that received services from their agency in Section 5 of the CSBG Year-End Report.

Agencies likely administer community action programs that are not included on this crosswalk (i.e. Embrace Iowa). If the data is available, agencies are expected to report the unduplicated number of individuals or households served by those programs in the appropriate service(s).

## UNDUPLICATED COUNTS

An individual or household can only be reported once per service. Therefore, for the service an agency reports on, the agency must be able to track and report the unduplicated number of individuals or households for that service.

If an individual or household received the same service more than once during the reporting period, only report the individual or households in that service once. The same individual or household may however be reported in more than one service, but only once under each service received.

## IOWA FADSS SYSTEM

Using the Iowa FaDSS System, agencies can report FaDSS individuals in the following 7 services:

- EMPLOYMENT (1i, 1k, 1l, and 1q)
- INCOME AND ASSET BUILDING (3i)
- HEALTH AND SOCIAL/BEHAVIORAL DEVELOPMENT (5c)
- SERVICES SUPPORTING MULTIPLE DOMAINS (7a)

Agencies should report the number of FaDSS individuals in each of these services if their agency is able to report an unduplicated number of individuals for the service(s).
