IOWA WEATHERIZATION PROGRAM NOTICE 14-02

- DATE: September 25, 2014
- RE: OSHA Training Requirements

The requirement for OSHA training for all on-site weatherization employees and contractors has been eliminated.

Listed below are revisions to weatherization manuals.

Standards

Section 1030 Worker Safety - deleted second paragraph

Policies & Procedures Section 5.71

Third paragraph modified to read:

Local agencies must have a written safety plan in effect. A copy of the safety plan must be provided to all weatherization personnel. All agency weatherization personnel must receive orientation training on the agency's safety plan. DOE requires all weatherization workers to have an OSHA Construction Safety course. Team leaders or on site supervisors must complete the 30 hour course. Other crew members must complete the 10 hour course. Weatherization workers will receive the required OSHA training course by January 1, 2012.

Contractor Health and Safety - deleted

Monitoring Agencies' Health and Safety Plans modified to read:

DCAA will monitor both job sites and agency files for compliance with OSHA requirements. Agencies must provide DCAA with OSHA certificate of completions for all workers and job site supervisors, both crew based and contractor based.

Section 6.12 - delete the last bullet
