Ida County Public Health A Department of Horn Memorial Hospital Community Health Improvement Plan Process On July 27, 2022, a Horn Memorial Hospital (HMH) committee of nine members met to discuss and prioritize the health needs identified from the PRC Community Health Needs Assessment Report. The following priorities were identified as top concerns through the community key informant survey:

1. Mental Health

4. Respiratory Disease

7. Injury & Violence

2. Substance Abuse

5. Cancer

8. Access to Healthcare

3. Heart Disease & Stroke

6. Oral Health

On September 26, 2022, the Horn Memorial Hospital Board of Trustees officially reviewed and approved the four prioritized significant community needs, and initiatives related to these areas.

Injury & Violence - A relatively low priority assigned to the need

The Ida County Community Alliance (ICCA) discussed the PRC Community Health Needs Assessment Report and reviewed the identified eight areas of concern at regular meetings November 2022 and January 2023. The group developed goals and objectives for the top two priority areas, identified through the Key Informant Survey, for Ida County Public Health. Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder can be co-occurring and affect health outcomes in many ways.
