Mental Health/Substance Abuse

- Goal: Public general awareness of mental health/substance abuse, access points for mental health/substance abuse and self care.
- Objective: Reduce the Poor Physical Health Days for Wapello County from 3.4 to 3.0 by December 31, 2027

- Strategies: Develop a one page reference guide(include other languages) to be available for schools during parent nights, transition fairs and all community events.
- Promote mental health/substance abuse screenings by primary care practitioners/pediatricians during wellness exams.
- Promote community to touch base with friends and family.

• Promote positive messages on social media.

Housing and Homelessness

- Goal: Improve housing quality and affordability
- Objective: Increase the number of quality and affordable housing for new comers by 2% December 31, 2027.

- Strategies: Educate the community through forum's, and speakers at local conferences.
- Initiate a referral network. (One Stop Shop).
- Survey the homeless population for data needs.
- Initiate support for Wapello County employers that assist in providing housing with subsidized rent and child care.

• Public Health will promote safe and affordable housing for all residents of Wapello County.

Child Care

- Goals: Increase the number of quality child care programs.
- Objective: Increase the Level Quality Rating and Improvement System (QRIS)) for registered child developmental homes to level 2 to 45% in Wapello County by December 31, 2025

- Strategies: Advocate to reduce the process to open an In-Home daycare. (Keep the quality)
- Develop a resource list for providers
- Advocate for more incentives for wages and benefits for daycare employees
- Advocate local businesses to have buy in and partner to promote and sustain child care centers.
- Advocate for Tuition assistance from a variety of resources.
