# Background

Funding comes from Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Strategic Prevention Framework - Partnerships for Success grant.

- Cooperative agreement with input from SAMHSA.
- HHS staff meets with SAMHSA staff on a regular basis to discuss the project.
- Additional requirements from SAMHSA will be passed to sub-recipient agencies.



# PFS-PAM Project Overview



#### Funded Counties Will:

•Utilize the Strategic Prevention Framework (SPF) model.

 Cómplete all steps of the process according to Department guidance.

- Build prevention capacity.
- Collaborate across multiple sectors.
- Promote and utilize the Culturally and Linguistically Appropriate Services (CLAS) Standards.



## PFS-PAM Objectives

 Reduce the rate of adult (45 years and older) binge drinking by at least 5% in 90% of funded counties.

2. Enhance the infrastructure of involved countywide coalitions through participation in ongoing technical assistance and training with broad stakeholder involvement to ensure buy in and engagement in funded counties.




## PFS-PAM Objectives

#### PFS-PAM Coordinator

- One Full-Time Equivalent position per county.
  - Can be split into two .50 positions.
    - Should have two to three years of substance misuse prevention experience.
      - Hired by July 17, 2023

- Supervisor will be responsible for implementing services if Coordinator is absent for two or more consecutive weeks.
