## TERMS

## LATINO

Refers to people living in the U.S. whose
heritage is derived from:

- Caribbean Islands,
- Central America
- Mexico
- and South America

Latinos speak many Indigenous
languages, and romance languages, such as French, Italian, Spanish, and Portuguese. NOT all Latinos speak Spanish.

LATINX, LATINE, \& LATIN@ Gender-neutral and inclusive terms that are used as an alternative to Latino or Latina.

## HISPANIC

Refers to individuals in the U.S. whose heritage is derived from Spanish speaking countries - the term is about LANGUAGE. It Includes individuals from SPAIN.

## SPANISH

1. Individuals from Spain.
2. A Romance language spoken in Spain and parts of North, Central and South America. It is the second most widely spoken first language in the world.

CITIZENS OR
PERMANENT RESIDENTS

A student must be a U.S. CITIZEN OR PERMANENT RESIDENT to be eligible for Federal Financial Aid, regardless of their parents' immigration status.

## A student is a U.S. citizen if:

- They were born in the United States or certain U.S. territories
- They were born abroad to parents who are U.S. citizens
- They have obtained citizenship status through naturalization

A student is a Permanent Resident if they have a GREEN CARD

## STUDENTS WITH DACA OR TPS:

## DACA \& TPS

- Have a work authorization card
- Can request a Social Security Number
- Are NOT eligible for lowa Financial Aid
- Are NOT eligible for Federal Financial Aid
- BUT, they might qualify for local grants, private funds and/or financial assistance from postsecondary institutions.
