Policy

USDA Federal Regulations:

(3) An estimate of Statewide participation for the coming fiscal year by category of women, infants, and children.

USDA Federal Regulations:

Participants means pregnant women, breastfeeding women, postpartum women, infants and children who are receiving supplemental foods or food instruments or cash-value vouchers under the Program, and the breastfed infants of participant breastfeeding women.

Participation means the sum of:

- (1) The number of persons who received supplemental foods or food instruments during the reporting period
- (2) The number of infants who did not receive supplemental foods or food instruments but whose breastfeeding mother received supplemental foods or food instruments during the report period; and
- (3) The number of breastfeeding women who did not receive supplemental foods or food instruments but whose infant received supplemental foods or food instruments during the report period.

State Caseload Projection

The Iowa WIC Program plans to serve Priorities I through VI in FFY 2024. The Iowa WIC Program's estimated monthly statewide caseload for FFY 2024 is as follows:

- Women: 12,469
- Infant: 13,046
- Children: 32,132

Food Funds Projection

Planning assumes little, if any, growth beyond inflationary adjustment. The following factors are considered in projecting availability of food funds.

Factor	Anticipated Funding (FFY 24)
Federal food funds	40,975,174
Cost containment efforts (infant formula)	17,163,420
Total available food funds	58,138,594

Note: In FFY 2024, Iowa will be in the second year of a possible six-year contract period with Mead Johnson & Company, LLC holding the formula rebate contract for milk-based formulas and Abbott Laboratories, Inc. holding the formula rebate contract for soy formula.

NSA funding projection

For FFY 24, Iowa anticipates receiving base funding of \$17,389,053 of Nutrition Services and Administration (NSA) funds. Anticipated needs for Operational Adjustment (OA) funding for caseload management equal \$1,300,000. Total NSA and OA funds projected at \$18,689,053.
