Policy

USDA Federal Regulations:

(3) An estimate of Statewide participation for the coming fiscal year by category of women, infants, and children.

USDA Federal Regulations:

Participants means pregnant women, breastfeeding women, postpartum women, infants and children who are receiving supplemental foods or food instruments or cash-value vouchers under the Program, and the breastfed infants of participant breastfeeding women.

Participation means the sum of:

- (1) The number of persons who received supplemental foods or food instruments during the reporting period
- (2) The number of infants who did not receive supplemental foods or food instruments but whose breastfeeding mother received supplemental foods or food instruments during the report period; and
- (3) The number of breastfeeding women who did not receive supplemental foods or food instruments but whose infant received supplemental foods or food instruments during the report period.

Food Funds Projection

Planning assumes little, if any, growth beyond inflationary adjustment. The following factors are considered in projecting availability of food funds.

Factor	Anticipated Funding (FFY 23)
Federal food funds	30,514,154
Cost containment efforts (infant formula)	13,782,872
Total available food funds	44,297,026

Note: In FFY 23, Mead Johnson & Company, LLC will hold the formula rebate contract for milk-based formulas and Abbott Laboratories, Inc. will hold the formula rebate contract for soy formula.

NSA funding projection

For FFY 23, Iowa anticipates receiving base funding of \$16,462,551 of Nutrition Services and Administration (NSA) funds. Anticipated needs for Operational Adjustment (OA) funding for caseload management equal \$1,227,229. Total NSA and OA funds projected at \$17,689,780.
